THE NEW WOODWARDS, VCN, and EVERYTHING...

In September, Steven C, our Technical Services Coordinator, submitted a proposal to City Hall on our behalf, that VCN be approved to occupy some of the Non-Profit Generic Space being made available at the restored iconic Woodward's Building on West Hastings Street.

The plan proposed we relocate our 'Special Projects' office from the 411 Senior's Centre to Woodward's new open space, designed for more comfortable office space, house about six workstations, and be better placed to receive visitors. The goal here is to expand our contact with the community, heighten and focus our program delivery, and at the same time, contribute to the socio-economic health of the downtown Eastside neighbourhood.

Since our activities are of interest to the general population, location at the Woodward's Building would allow us to amplify and extend our outreach to a greater community. Although there were numerous deserving applications for Woodward's space, thanks to Steven's excellent

submission, VCN was fortunate to make it to the short list, which went before City Council on Dec 3rd.

There, with Andrea Reimer in the chair, after pondering for 38 minutes, Mayor Gregor Robertson and council unanimously passed a motion to approve the recommended list.

The advisory panel met again early this year to discuss further space allocations. VCN will be placed on the second floor of the Woodward's development, sharing the building with other non-profits and a daycare. The City has postponed the actual move-in date for all non-profits as they predict the building will be completed late summer 2010. We are extremely excited to occupy this beautiful space. ...So as Brendan says, we at VCN wholeheartedly congratulate Steven, Kalia, and all who helped with the hard work to obtain council approval for VCN's place in the most desirable high profile Woodward's complex.

Handling Those Huge Picture Files via dial-Up...

Remember, I'm a 'dial-up' internet user just like you. In the old days, no-one ever sent me any pictures. But now, with all these dinky Digi-Cameras etc, friends and relatives send me a gazillion pics of kid's hockey, birds at Steveston, or a family bike trip to Wreck Beach.

And like you, I get guff from those cool 'Hi-Speed' guys like... "Do'ncha have Broadband?" or ... "Just get an Eye-Pod!" ...Whatever. ...Sigh! If your set up receives directly into MS Outlook Express, numerous such messages, could take an hour or two! So what to do?

I *always* preview my mail at VCN Web-Mail (or Squirrel Mail) ...at www2.vcn.bc.ca. This screen lists picture attachment sizes, and better yet, you can read, and reply to, the message, without viewing those huge megabyte pictures.

If the message window lists a bunch of pics totaling about 15 MB, (15 Megabytes,) the dial-up download at 3 minutes per megabyte, is about 45 minutes, or more, plus the time you already spent pondering things. ...Plus another 45 mins for each such message! ...Frustrated yet? Your phone's tied up, and you need to call your podiatrist.

THE ED'S SECRET ANSWER...

I added a folder to my Web Mail screen titled VIEW LATER.

Now, whenever I get a message with over 3 MB attached, I reply sweetly...

"Thanks for the lovely pics, I'll view them later."

And send it off. ...Then, I MOVE the message into my new VIEW LATER folder.

My inbox often contains 3 or 4 such messages. So now what? ...That depends.

If you're fortunate to have a Wireless/Wifi capable laptop, just take it to the nearest Wifi equipped Internet Café, Local Library, or community centre, and log on! There may be a user fee. ...VCN offers free Wifi access during normal office hours at 411 Dunsmuir, Vancouver downtown.

Desk-top users should visit a local CAP site, Public Library, local Community Centre, Senior Centre, some schools, and we hope some Royal Canadian Legions. Ask your local social centre to look into a VCN Public Access Computer, or PAC Site! These are hi-speed, and you can quickly view those family pictures, do a bit of Googling, etc.

Depending on your computer, experience level, you should be able to COPY these images to your CD, or USB Thumb-drive. ...Because of differing operating systems, you'll probably need assistance at first from someone at the site to do these things.

I had some difficulty confirming the download... However, I'm advised the best way is to 'Copy to' my disk. To confirm you are really accessing your disk or T-drive, it's a good idea to have a few familiar picture files on your disk, so at the finish, you can verify the new stuff is there among your old files.

This all may seem like a lot of fussing, but if you receive a lot of large files, using CAP sites and Wifi is really a time saver... It's nice and social too. Enjoy our new issue... Cheers, Tony the Ed.

Drop in Friday with your questions! Show your photo ID to receive free dial-up Internet access (and a free @vcn.bc.ca email). Learn how to dial up to the Internet from your home.

DIAL-UP CONNECTION PROBLEMS...

There are a few basic areas where a Dial up problem can occur. Errors often occur between your computer and your modem, between your modem and our server, or our server does not accept your username/password.

Here are a few common **Error Codes** and the most common solution for them.

678 - There is no answer.

Solution: Check that you are dialing to the correct server. 604-638-0189 for regular VCN users

680 - There is no dial tone.

Solution: Ensure that your phone line is connected to a phone outlet and to the correct port on your modem, usually Line or Line In

691 - Access denied because username and/or password is invalid on the domain.

Solution: For VCN accounts, you only need the username and not the @vcn.bc.ca, also your username and password are both case sensitive

797 - The modem could not be found.

Solution: If your modem seems to be correctly installed and you receive this error, you need to install/update the driver for the modem

Two other common problems are software configuration and line quality.

Email programs such as Outlook, **sometimes automatically disconnect** you after it is done checking your email. This can usually be fixed in your email program's **General Settings**.

If you are experiencing **frequent random disconnections**, your line quality could be the problem. Try changing or shortening the phone line and remove any splitters.

This is a more complex question than one might imagine. Hi Speed access is only available via very sophisticated and resource rich servers, whose systems we would need to match, or re-sell.

A VCN special committee is vigorously examining this, but for now our resources fall short of providing such a service both reliably or significantly less than is now commercially available.

Much also depends on the stability of CRTC regulations re the re-selling of Internet services, and our ability to fend off the present strong lobby to reduce such third party access.

...We will need everyone's help, and we shall see!
