Youth Internship Program

The Youth Internship Program is completed for the 2016-17 term. Since October, VCN has coordinated and supported 49 youth interns with 38 non-profit organizations in Metro-Vancouver, and interns will finish their placements on March 17. We are happy to report that 100% of the interns felt that the internship helped them acquire technical and practical skills that will make them more employable!

The program coordinators will be hard at work until the end of their term, March 31st, to ensure that final reports and the cross-Canada videography project is completed and sent to Industry Canada.

Open Source Software Policy

The Vancouver Community Network (VCN) will make every effort to use open-source software on removable media, over the Internet or installed on hard-drives with some exceptions:

- It is freeware
- It is an existing license(s) prior to policy date
- It is found to be financially-unsupportable to create/use an open source option

The reasons for this policy is:

Proprietary software goes against our mission to promote digital inclusion.

In support of this policy, the board will require:

1. Yearly audits of software currently being used by VCN in their offices and computer access points. The first audit presented will form the pre-approved software for use by VCN which is to be updated by any and all approved purchases from that point forward.

2. Any purchase of software other than updates for applications identified on the list will require the approval of the Board.

Need Help With Your Taxes?

VCN is here to help make you aware of services that you can take advantage of to file your 2016 taxes. Keep in mind that most Canadian residents have to file an income tax return for the previous year, to pay the accurate amount of income tax owed, to pay back overpayment of benefits and/or to claim certain benefits (such as GST credit or the Guaranteed Income Supplement under the Old Age Security Program). If you are an international and non-resident individual, you may also have to file a Canadian income tax return.

Volunteer Tax Clinics

Canada operates several tax clinics nationwide. These clinics are run by volunteers during tax season who will help you complete your returns and get all your paperwork ready.
