Street Messaging System News

VCN has been reimaging itself in recent years. A key aim is to reduce the reliance we feel on government funding and projects that are getting more complicated to deliver every year. For that reason we have been focused on increasing our

tech|team and web|team fee-for-service work. It also means being innovative around internet technology service that can lead to positive change. This is why the work we do with the **Street Messaging System (SMS)** is so worthwhile.

In the Fall, we heard from the beta-users of the SMS that they wanted to use the system for their more direct messaging needs so we have re-coded for the last few months to allow for internal groups and lists that can instantly reach the intended persons quickly and easily. In April SWAN (Sex Worker Advocacy Network) started using the system to text the bad date list. Prior to this, they would send each text message many individual times. Now it reaches all their lists in one step. I

Other upgrades include:

- Uniform code allows for multiple languages
- Much larger text field to allow for messages longer than 140 characters
- Neighbourhood selection criteria to limit messages to the city & community most relevant to reach.



Mobile is the future.

Text messaging has a 100% open rate while emails are 48%. The potential of this system is huge!
