Servers

- All web servers were updated to PHP 7. Some clients still require PHP 5 for their web site. They have been warned to update their web site to support PHP 7 because PHP 5.6 will stop receiving security updates on December 31, 2018.
- In early 2018, VCN received \$5,000 of credits for Amazon Web Services through a CIRA pilot



project. The credits will be used to host StreetMessenger.

Office

- In May 2018, VCN started to use the open source software CiviCRM for donations. Wai-Kin
 imported contacts and donation records from the old donation database and created new
 guides for volunteers.
- In April and May 2018, three BCIT students and one student from Fairleigh Dickinson University started their work-term at VCN. The BCIT students have been providing technical support to our clients.
- In April 2018, almost all of the office computers were upgraded through a donation from the BC Technology for Learning Society (Computers for Schools BC).
- In April 2018, a laptop, a network switch, and a surge protector were stolen from VCN's public computer lab in the common area outside of VCN's office.
